


WIDE SHOTS
Wide-angle sceneries will allow you to keep your subject[s] unveiled as imperceptible [non-identifiable] silhouettes





























2 Deserted Theatres ATMOSPHERIC EMPTINESS

Body and skin collect memories. They carve into furrows. Same for objects. They collect marks. **Even scars & dust tell stories**



Bare napes, a silhouette, a posture, a curtain of hair, a haircut... Collect clues preserving mystery




























5 HIDING WITH HUMOUR

Play with a sibling















































6 COMPOSE / SCULPT WITH LIGHTS & SHADOWS




















